

Keep our kitchen safe

Please read before using the kitchen. These simple rules keep everyone safe.



Hot water boiler

Never carry or tip the boiler while it holds hot water. Leave it to cool first, and take care to avoid scalds when drawing hot water.



Children stay supervised

Children are only allowed in the kitchen under close supervision. No running, and keep the kitchen from becoming overcrowded.



Electrical equipment

Do not use or touch any appliance that looks damaged or wet. Only PAT-tested appliances may be used, and never leave one running unattended.



Cleaning products

Wear the protective gloves provided when handling cleaning chemicals. Keep them in their labelled containers and out of children's reach.



Clean up spills

Wipe up spills straight away to prevent slips. Keep floors and walkways clear, especially around the cooker and sink.



Keep exits clear

Make sure fire exit doors stay clear and unlocked while the hall is in use. Know your nearest exit and the assembly point.



If someone is hurt or you spot a fault

The first aid box is in the sliding-door cupboard in the hallway. Record every accident in the accident book kept with it and tell a committee member. Report any damage or faulty equipment, and label it so no one uses it.
